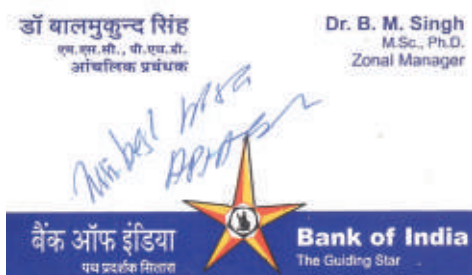

DOWN THE MEMORY LANE

Nostalgia is a file that removes the rough edges from the good old days...

Each one of us has our own memories... As time passes by and we look back into those days we get nostalgic of our own past. Dr. B. M. Singh, Registrar of IUJ shares his nostalgia here with the readers...

I am shocked and driven into the valley of sorrow on hearing about the sad demise of Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam, our former President of India. I had the privilege of meeting Dr. Kalam thrice personally. Dr. Kalam was a great scientist, leader, motivator and statesman of the present era.



I got an opportunity to meet him for the first time at Bokaro when he was the Chief Scientific Advisor to the Government of India. On my way to Bokaro from Dhanbad by road, 3-4 kms away from the airport I found people rushing towards the airport and on enquiring I came to know that the helicopter carrying Dr. Kalam and the then Minister of Science and Technology, Shree Samresh Singh (my brother-in-law) had fallen from about ten feet above the ground level while landing. I was shocked and rushed to the airport. When I reached there I was surprised to see both Dr. Kalam and Shree Singh calm and talking to people. (This incidence is briefly mentioned by Dr. Kalam too in his great work "The Ignited Mind").

Soon after this incident Dr. Kalam took part in all his pre-scheduled meetings as if nothing has happened. Such was the personality of Dr. Kalam At that time, as the Zonal Manager of the lead Bank of Bank of India, I was given the responsibility of coordinating the finance of planting of medicinal plants in Jharkhand. In one of the meetings organized in this regard, I remember, Dr. Kalam said to me, "Dr. Singh, I know you are dealing with public money and as a banker your prime duty is to protect the interest of people. But, since you are a product of a National Institute of Government of India, you must work like a scientist. Forget what people think about you. Do your best with humility and silence for the welfare of the masses".

I am unable to recompose myself remembering the personal advice of the 'Missile Man of India' at his sudden departure for heavenly abode and I cannot stop myself from sharing an autograph from Dr. Kalam which I had taken in a family get-together.
