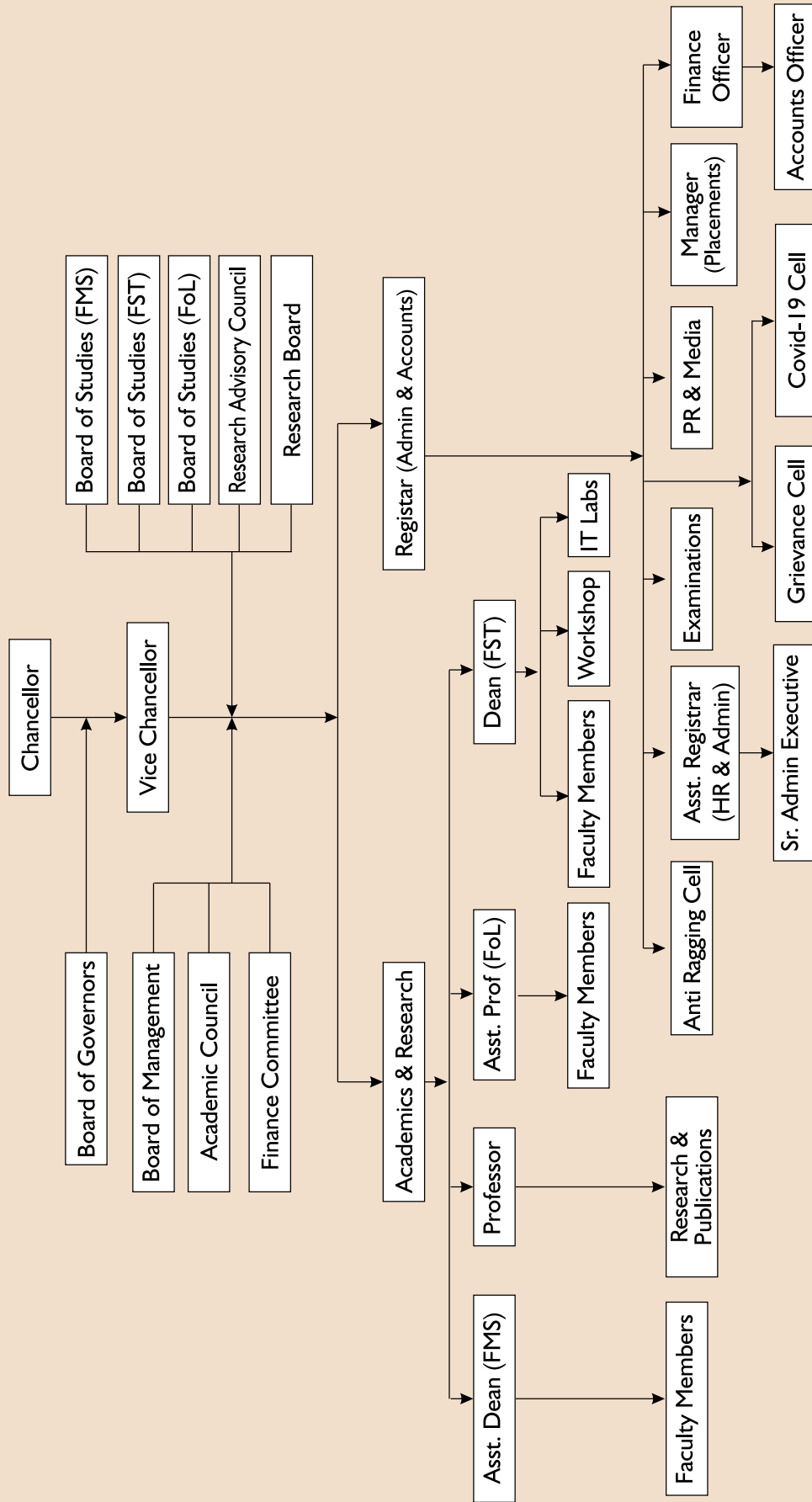

Students have access to the finest collection of contemporary books, journals and digital library, which supplement the prescribed reference books and textbooks, providing students an opportunity to gain contemporary knowledge in all relevant disciplines going well beyond the classroom-based program.

### Faculty of Management Studies (FMS)

**The Ph.D. Program (Part time) in Management:** The part-time Ph.D. Program in Management is designed for working corporate executives and faculty members, to expose them to develop in-depth research skills and gain in-depth understanding of the subject, which will help them to improve their ability for teaching, research and their own profession.

**Duration of the Program:** This program is normally for a period of four years, wherein the scholar is required to complete the course work, prepare and defend thesis. Maximum duration of the program is seven years. However, in exceptional cases, this can be extended further, subject to approval.

**Eligibility:** The applicant should meet the following eligibility requirements for admission:

**Qualification:** Post-Graduation (minimum 2 years duration) or equivalent, in management or allied subjects (like Economics, Commerce, Public Administration, Social Sciences, etc.), with at least 55% marks or equivalent CGPA or M.Phil Degree in the concerned subject or allied subject.

**Experience:** Minimum 3 years in industry/banking / financial services / government / academics etc.

**Program Structure:** The program consists of the following phases:

**Phase I-Course Work:** Comprises two theory subjects, Research Methods and Elective, covering broadly the field of specialization, chosen by the scholar.

**Phase II-Registration for Ph.D:** Scholars, who successfully complete the coursework, can register for the Ph.D program.

**Phase III-Preparation of Research Proposal:** The scholar will prepare the research proposal under the guidance of the Research Supervisor and the same will be presented in a Seminar for approval.

**Phase IV-Data Collection / Survey:** After approval of the proposal, the scholar will collect the needed data and take up the survey. The scholar is expected to present a Seminar on "Progress of Research".

**Phase V-Report on Progress of Research:** The scholar works under the guidance of a Research Supervisor and is required to submit at the end of every semester, a report on Progress of Research and also present the same in a seminar.

**Phase VI-Pre-Submission Thesis Seminar:** This Seminar is presented by the scholar, whose Ph.D thesis is ready for submission.

**Phase VII-Submission of Ph.D. Thesis and Viva Voce**

**Award of Degree:** Successful scholars will receive the Ph.D degree from the University, subject to University regulations.

**The MBA Program:** The MBA Program of the University prepares the students with the knowledge, skills and strategic perspectives essential to business leadership and a managerial career in the world. The MBA Program is designed to provide both a portfolio of strong functional skills and the ability to apply, adapt and integrate those skills in different management settings.

**Duration:** Two years

**Eligibility:** Graduation in any discipline with 45% and above aggregate marks.

**Program Structure:** The Program covers 28 courses apart from soft skills and management thesis spread over 4 semesters in 2 years. Students are also required to undergo a summer internship program for 10 weeks.

**Electives:** The students are encouraged to choose eight courses from eight elective streams namely, Marketing, HRM, Finance, Banking, Investments, Insurance, Accounting and IT & Systems. Students will have the flexibility in choosing more than one course from these elective streams. Students will also have the facility for dual specialization. Elective courses will be offered

subject to a minimum number of students enrolling for a particular elective course.

**Award of Degree:** Successful students will receive the MBA degree from the University, subject to University regulations.

**MBA Program for Working Professionals:** In order to cater to the needs of working professionals aspiring to pursue MBA, this program is being offered from 2013-14 academic year. Duration and program structure for this program are the same as for the regular MBA Program, except that the regular classes are held in the evening and during weekends.

**Eligibility:** Graduation in any discipline with 45% and above aggregate marks and a minimum of 2 years of work experience

**Award of Degree:** Successful students will receive the MBA degree from the University, subject to University regulations. Students who have successfully completed first two semesters of the MBA Program and are unable to pursue the third semester will be awarded Diploma in Business Administration. They will be allowed to register for 3<sup>rd</sup> semester of subsequent batch, within 3 years, by paying re-admission fee and semester fee applicable for that batch of students and complete the MBA Program. MBA Program will be awarded to the successful students, on return of the Diploma that was awarded.

**The BBA Program:** The Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) Program is a 3 year full-time program offered by the University with a view to impart in-depth knowledge and broad understanding of the basics of Management. The BBA Program focuses on various areas of Management and prepares students for a Professional career in Management and also equips them to pursue MBA Program in due course.

**Duration:** Three Years.

**Eligibility:** Pass in 10+2 with 40% and above aggregate marks in any discipline.

**Program Structure:** The BBA Program consists of 36 courses covered in six semesters spread over three years. Students are also required to do two Summer Internships after completion of Year I and II of the program.

**Elective Streams:** During the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> semester, students are exposed to elective courses in their respective fields of specialization. These elective courses provide an understanding of the specialized focus fields.

**Award of Degree:** Students who successfully complete the BBA Program will be awarded the 'Bachelor of Business Administration' Degree by the University subject to the University regulations.

**The B.Com (Hons) Program:** The Bachelor of Commerce [B.Com (Hons)] Program is a 3-year campus based program offered by the University with a view to

impart in-depth knowledge and broad understanding of accounting and financial management. The curriculum of B.Com (Hons.) program provides carefully selected subject combination of accountancy, economics, management and decision science, banking & insurance and commercial law. The program prepares the students with the knowledge, skills and attitude to meet the challenges of the modern day business organizations and also equips them to pursue M.Com or MBA degree program and other professional courses further or a career in Banking / Financial Services / Insurance / Corporates.

**Duration:** Three Years.

**Eligibility:** Pass in 10+2 in any discipline inclusive of Commerce with 40% and above aggregate marks.

**Award of Degree:** Students who successfully complete the B.Com (Hons.) Program will be awarded the 'Bachelor of Commerce (Hons.) degree by the University, subject to the University Regulations.

**The BA (Hons.) in Journalism & Mass Communication:** The Bachelor of Arts (Hons.) in Journalism and Mass Communication is a three year, six semester, full-time, campus-based program, with a view to impart the students an in-depth academic base and hands-on skills in Journalism and Mass Communications so that they can build a career in fields like Journalism, Advertising, Media Management, Event Management, Public Relations etc.

**Duration:** Three Years.

**Eligibility:** Pass in 10+2 in any discipline with 40% and above aggregate marks.

**Award of Degree:** Successful students will receive the Bachelor of Arts (Hons.) Degree in Journalism and Mass Communication, subject to University Regulations.

## Faculty of Science & Technology (FST)

**The B.Tech Program:** The B.Tech. Program is a four-year, eight-semester, full-time, campus-based program. The Program provides cutting edge education to equip students with comprehensive and critical understanding in various branches of engineering.

The following branches of engineering are offered:

- a. Computer Science & Engineering
- b. Mechanical Engineering
- c. Mining Engineering

**Eligibility:** The eligibility criteria for admission into the B.Tech Program is 50% aggregate and above in 12<sup>th</sup> Class examinations or its equivalent with Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and English as subjects. The applicant should fulfill the minimum age requirements as prescribed by the respective board through which the applicant has appeared

for the qualifying examination. Students who pass 3 year Diploma program in respective branch of Engineering will be eligible for admission into second year of B.Tech program by Lateral Entry.

**Award of Degree:** On successful completion of the Program, students will be awarded B.Tech Degree by the University, subject to University regulations.

**The BCA Program:** The program provides a sound academic base in computer skills and IT applications, from which an advanced career in computer applications can be developed. The students get a good conceptual grounding in computer usage and its practical business applications. The BCA Program focuses on various areas of IT and prepares students for a career in the field of Information Technology and also equips them to pursue MCA program in due course.

**Eligibility:** Pass in 10+2/Intermediate with aggregate 40% and above in any discipline.

**Duration:** Three years

During the 5<sup>th</sup> semester, students are exposed to elective courses in their respective field of specialization. These elective courses provide an understanding of the specialized focus fields.

**Award of Degree:** Students who successfully complete the BCA Program will be awarded the 'Bachelor of Computer Applications' degree by the University, subject to University regulations.

**The MCA Program:** The Master of Computer Applications (MCA) is a three year, six semester, full-time, campus-based program, with a view to impart the students an in-depth academic base in IT and hands-on skills in computer applications so that they can build an advanced career in IT. The program covers cutting-edge technology inputs as well as provides IT skills in programming and application development, as per industry requirements. Students that passed BCA or BSc (IT or Computer Science) Degree, with Mathematics as a subject at 10+2 level or Degree level are eligible for Lateral Entry and join second year (3<sup>rd</sup> semester) of the program.

**Duration:** Three years (Two years for Lateral Entry)

**Eligibility:** For MCA: Graduation (10+2+3 or 10+2+4) in any discipline, with 40% and above aggregate marks.

**Award of Degree:** Successful students will receive the MCA degree from the University, subject to University Regulations.

**The Diploma in Technology Program:** The Diploma in Technology Program is a three-year, six-semester, full-time, campus-based program. The Program provides cutting edge education to equip the students with comprehensive and critical understanding in Engineering Discipline. The program prepares the students for

Careers in Engineering and also equips them to pursue B.Tech in the respective branch of Engineering through lateral entry into second year (3<sup>rd</sup> semester) of B.Tech program.

**Duration:** Three years

**Eligibility:** Pass in 10<sup>th</sup> Class with 50% aggregate with pass in each of the Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry. The applicant should fulfill the minimum age requirements as prescribed by the respective board through which the applicant has appeared for the qualifying examination.

**Award of Degree:** On successful completion of the Diploma in Technology Program, students will be awarded Diploma in Technology by the University, subject to University Regulations.

The following branches of engineering are offered:

- a. Computer Science & Engineering
- b. Mechanical Engineering
- c. Mining Engineering

### Faculty of Law (FoL)

**The BBA-LL.B (Hons) Program:** The BBA-LL.B (Hons.) is a five-year, ten-semester, full-time, campus-based program. The Program offers a thorough and deep knowledge of the law courses to the students. The program includes law and management courses, which consist of 4 Clinical, 6 Electives, 8 Honours Courses and 5 Legal Internships.

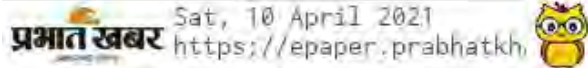

## e-Conference on "Copyright Regime in the Digital Era" held at ICFAI

Today, the ICFAI University Jharkhand organized National e-Conference on "Changing Contours of Copyright Regime in the Digital Era: Challenges & Opportunities". Key Speakers were Dr. Venkat Reddy, IPH Attorney and Founder, IPR Association, Hyderabad; Shri Prashant Kumar Singh, Member, Bar Council of India; Shri Rajesh Pande, Secretary, Jharkhand State Bar Council; Shri Heemanth Khosla, Deputy Registrar, Copyright Office, Govt. of India; and Dr. A.V.N. Rao, Director, ICFAI Law School, IIPH, Hyderabad. Dr. K. Srinivas, Director (Research and Training) and Dr. M.B.S. Murthy, Associate Professor & Registrar, both from National University for Studies and Research in Law (NUSRL), Ranchi chaired the technical sessions. Research Papers were presented by researchers, practitioners and students from reputed institutions like National Law Universities, IIT, Khurapur etc.

Welcoming the participants, Prof. G.R.S. Rao, Vice Chancellor of the University said, "In ancient India, Knowledge - the output of human intellect was shared freely through generations from Guru to Sahasra, for public good. However, in the recent times, as knowledge became a major source of wealth creation, right to that knowledge that is Copyright, has been taking a centre stage, to encourage the creators of the new knowledge".

"As the world is increasingly becoming more digital, Copyright protection should keep pace with technology - at the same time, balancing the interests of 'creators/owners and the public users, like educational institutions'. Explaining the basic tenets of Copyright, which includes originality, tangible expression of idea and commercial implications, Dr.

AVN, Rao emphasized the importance of Moral Rights of the author, by giving examples. Dr. Venkat Reddy narrated the significance of Fair Use Doctrine under Copyright Act, referring to the Delhi High Court Judgment in the case of University of Oxford vs. Hameshwar Photocopy services wherein the Court held that Copyright is not a divine right and is intended to increase the harvest of knowledge, not to impede it. Referring to the advent of Online Education in the wake of COVID-19 Pandemic, Shri Prashant Kumar Singh explained how the Judiciary fully supported use of copyright educational content to ensure of education. Murthy highlighted that Indian IPR Protection regime is on par with that in developed countries. 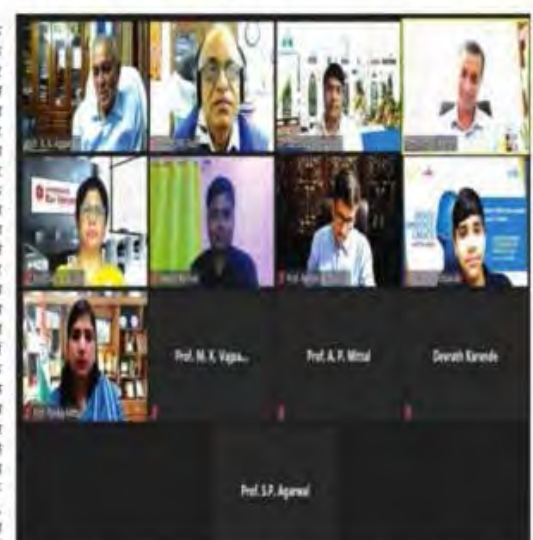
