Regular meetings of the University authorities, viz., Board of Governors, Board of Management, Academic Council, Finance Committee and Boards of Study, are being conducted, as per the provisions of the Act and the Statutes.

We are grateful to the Government of Jharkhand for their encouragement and support. Its continued support will go a long way, in continuing its services as a Values based University in the State.

The enclosed report gives details of activities of the University for the year 2021-22.

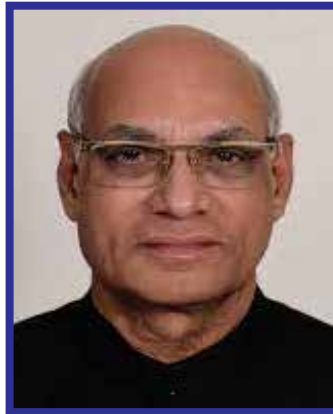

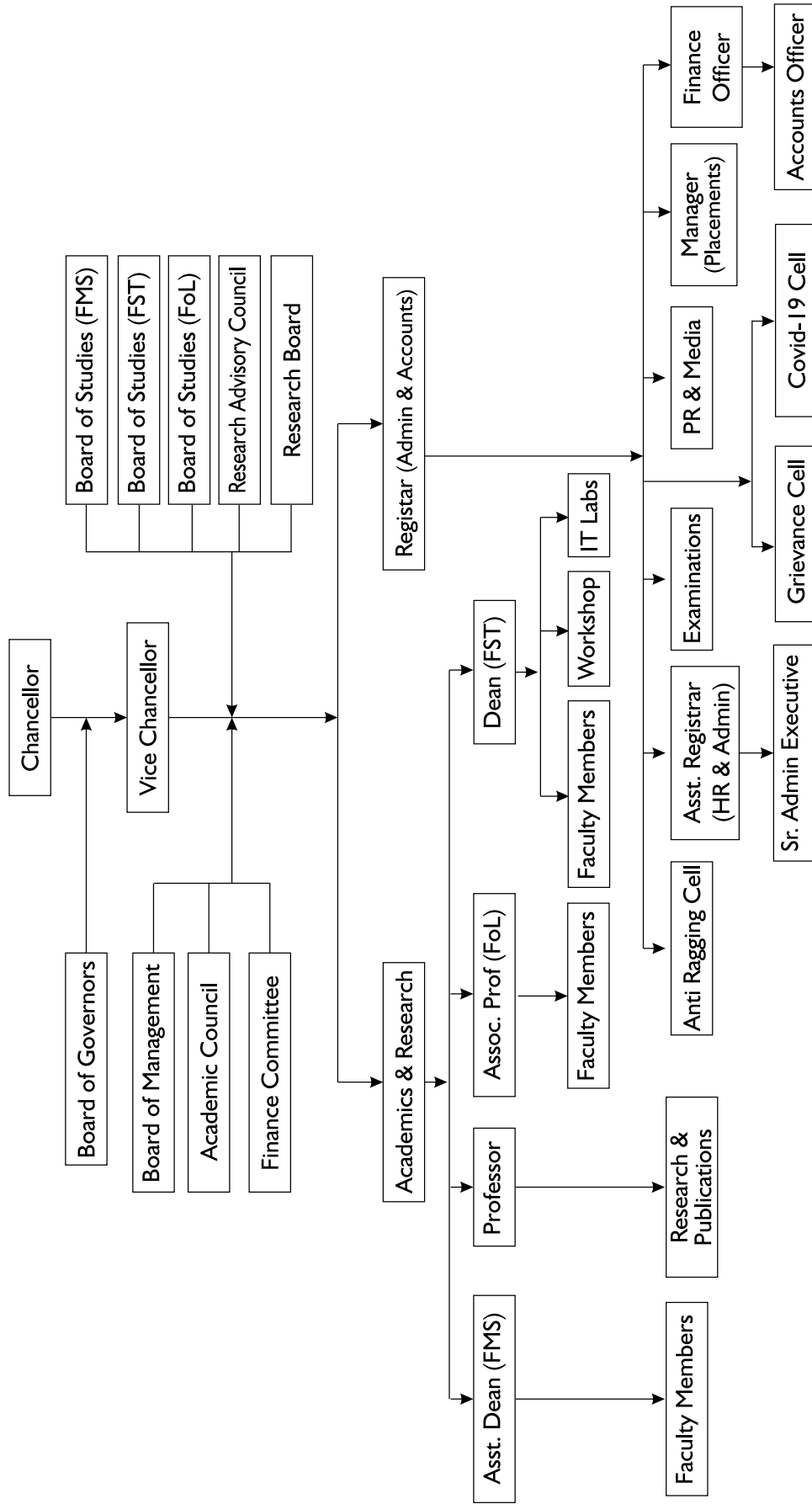

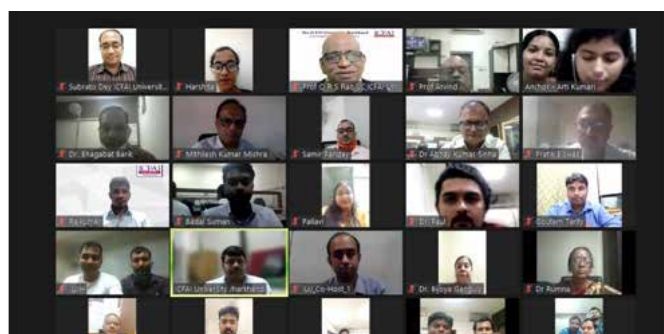

### Faculty of Management Studies (FMS)

**The Ph.D. Program (Part time) in Management:** The part-time Ph.D. Program in Management is designed for working corporate executives and faculty members, to expose them to develop in-depth research skills and gain in-depth understanding of the subject, which will help them to improve their ability for teaching, research and their own profession.

**Duration of the Program:** This program is normally for a period of four years, wherein the scholar is required to complete the course work, prepare and defend thesis. Maximum duration of the program is seven years. However, in exceptional cases, this can be extended further, subject to approval.

**Eligibility:** The applicant should meet the following eligibility requirements for admission:

**Qualification:** Post-Graduation (minimum 2 years duration) or equivalent, in management or allied subjects (like Economics, Commerce, Public Administration, Social Sciences, etc.), with at least 55% marks or equivalent CGPA or M.Phil Degree in the concerned subject or allied subject.

**Experience:** Minimum 3 years in industry/banking / financial services / government / academics etc.

**Program Structure:** The program consists of the following phases:

**Phase I-Course Work:** Comprises two theory subjects, Research Methods and Elective, covering broadly the field of specialization, chosen by the scholar.

**Phase II-Registration for Ph.D:** Scholars, who successfully complete the coursework, can register for the Ph.D program.

**Phase III-Preparation of Research Proposal:** The scholar will prepare the research proposal under the guidance of the Research Supervisor and the same will be presented in a Seminar for approval.

**Phase IV-Data Collection / Survey:** After approval of the proposal, the scholar will collect the needed data and take up the survey. The scholar is expected to present a Seminar on "Progress of Research".

**Phase V-Report on Progress of Research:** The scholar works under the guidance of a Research Supervisor and is required to submit at the end of every semester, a report on Progress of Research and also present the same in a seminar.

**Phase VI-Pre-Submission Thesis Seminar:** This Seminar is presented by the scholar, whose Ph.D thesis is ready for submission.

**Phase VII-Submission of Ph.D. Thesis and Viva Voce**

**Award of Degree:** Successful scholars will receive the Ph.D degree from the University, subject to University regulations.

**The MBA Program:** The MBA Program of the University prepares the students with the knowledge, skills and strategic perspectives essential to business leadership and a managerial career in the world. The MBA Program is designed to provide both a portfolio of strong functional skills and the ability to apply, adapt and integrate those skills in different management settings.

**Duration:** Two years

**Eligibility:** Graduation in any discipline with 45% and above aggregate marks.

**Program Structure:** The Program covers 28 courses apart from soft skills and management thesis spread over 4 semesters in 2 years. Students are also required to undergo a summer internship program for 10 weeks.

**Electives:** The students are encouraged to choose eight courses from eight elective streams namely, Marketing, HRM, Finance, Banking, Investments, Insurance, Accounting and IT & Systems. Students will have the



flexibility in choosing more than one course from these elective streams. Students will also have the facility for dual specialization. Elective courses will be offered subject to a minimum number of students enrolling for a particular elective course.

**Award of Degree:** Successful students will receive the MBA degree from the University, subject to University regulations.

**MBA Program for Working Professionals:** In order to cater to the needs of working professionals aspiring to pursue MBA, this program is being offered from 2013-14 academic year. Duration and program structure for this program are the same as for the regular MBA Program, except that the regular classes are held in the evening and during weekends.

**Eligibility:** Graduation in any discipline with 45% and above aggregate marks and a minimum of 2 years of work experience

**Award of Degree:** Successful students will receive the MBA degree from the University, subject to University regulations. Students who have successfully completed first two semesters of the MBA Program and are unable to pursue the third semester will be awarded Diploma in Business Administration. They will be allowed to register for 3<sup>rd</sup> semester of subsequent batch, within 3 years, by paying re-admission fee and semester fee applicable for that batch of students and complete the MBA Program. MBA Program will be awarded to the successful students, on return of the Diploma that was awarded.

**The BBA Program:** The Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) Program is a 3 year full-time program offered by the University with a view to impart in-depth knowledge and broad understanding of the basics of Management. The BBA Program focuses on various areas of Management and prepares students for a Professional career in Management and also equips them to pursue MBA Program in due course.

**Duration:** Three Years.

**Eligibility:** Pass in 10+2 with 40% and above aggregate marks in any discipline.

**Program Structure:** The BBA Program consists of 36 courses covered in six semesters spread over three years. Students are also required to do two Summer Internships after completion of Year I and II of the program.

**Elective Streams:** During the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> semester, students are exposed to elective courses in their respective fields of specialization. These elective courses provide an understanding of the specialized focus fields.

**Award of Degree:** Students who successfully complete the

BBA Program will be awarded the 'Bachelor of Business Administration' Degree by the University subject to the University regulations.

**The B.Com (Hons) Program:** The Bachelor of Commerce [B.Com (Hons)] Program is a 3-year campus based program offered by the University with a view to impart in-depth knowledge and broad understanding of accounting and financial management. The curriculum of B.Com (Hons.) program provides carefully selected subject combination of accountancy, economics, management and decision science, banking & insurance and commercial law. The program prepares the students with the knowledge, skills and attitude to meet the challenges of the modern day business organizations and also equips them to pursue M.Com or MBA degree program and other professional courses further or a career in Banking / Financial Services / Insurance / Corporates.

**Duration:** Three Years.

**Eligibility:** Pass in 10+2 in any discipline inclusive of Commerce with 40% and above aggregate marks.

**Award of Degree:** Students who successfully complete the B.Com (Hons.) Program will be awarded the 'Bachelor of Commerce (Hons.) degree by the University, subject to the University Regulations.

### Faculty of Science & Technology (FST)

**The B.Tech Program:** The B.Tech. Program is a four-year, eight-semester, full-time, campus-based program. The Program provides cutting edge education to equip students with comprehensive and critical understanding in various branches of engineering.

The following branches of engineering are offered:

- a. Computer Science & Engineering
- b. Mechanical Engineering
- c. Mining Engineering

**Eligibility:** The eligibility criteria for admission into the B.Tech Program is 50% aggregate and above in 12<sup>th</sup> Class examinations or its equivalent with Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and English as subjects. The applicant should fulfill the minimum age requirements as prescribed by the respective board through which the applicant has appeared for the qualifying examination. Students who pass 3 year Diploma program in respective branch of Engineering will be eligible for admission into second year of B.Tech program by Lateral Entry.

**Award of Degree:** On successful completion of the Program, students will be awarded B.Tech Degree by the University, subject to University regulations.

**The BCA Program:** The program provides a sound academic base in computer skills and IT applications, from which an advanced career in computer applications can be developed. The students get a good conceptual grounding in computer usage and its practical business applications. The BCA Program focuses on various areas of IT and prepares students for a career in the field of Information Technology and also equips them to pursue MCA program in due course.

**Eligibility:** Pass in 10+2/Intermediate with aggregate 40% and above in any discipline.

**Duration:** Three years

During the 5<sup>th</sup> semester, students are exposed to elective courses in their respective field of specialization. These elective courses provide an understanding of the specialized focus fields.

**Award of Degree:** Students who successfully complete the BCA Program will be awarded the ‘Bachelor of Computer Applications’ degree by the University, subject to University regulations.

**The Diploma in Technology Program:** The Diploma in Technology Program is a three-year, six-semester, full-time, campus-based program. The Program provides cutting edge education to equip the students with comprehensive and critical understanding in Engineering Discipline. The program prepares the students for Careers in Engineering and also equips them to pursue B.Tech in the respective branch of Engineering through lateral entry into second year (3<sup>rd</sup> semester) of B.Tech program.

**Duration:** Three years

**Eligibility:** Pass in 10<sup>th</sup> Class with 50% aggregate with pass in each of the Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry. The applicant should fulfill the minimum age requirements as prescribed by the respective board through which the applicant has appeared for the qualifying examination.

**Award of Degree:** On successful completion of the Diploma in Technology Program, students will be awarded Diploma in Technology by the University, subject to University Regulations.

The following branches of engineering are offered:

- a. Computer Science & Engineering
- b. Mechanical Engineering
- c. Mining Engineering

## Faculty of Law (FoL)

**The BBA-LL.B (Hons) Program:** The BBA-LL.B (Hons.) is a five-year, ten-semester, full-time, campus-based program. The Program offers a thorough and deep knowledge of the law courses to the students. The program includes law and management courses, which consist of 4 Clinical, 6 Electives, 8 Honours Courses and 5 Legal Internships.

**Eligibility:** Pass in 10+2 or equivalent with 45% and above aggregate marks in any discipline (best of the 5 subjects including English).

**Duration:** Five years

**Award of Degree:** On successful completion of the Program, students will be awarded BBA-LL.B (Hons.) degree by the University, subject to University regulations.

**The LL.B Program:** The LL.B is a three-year, six-semester, full-time, campus-based program. The Program is contemporary and rigorous with innovatively designed curriculum. The program includes Clinical Courses and Legal Internships.

**Eligibility:** Pass with 45% and above aggregate marks in Graduation or equivalent (in any discipline). Applicants should not be more than 30 years of age as on the day of commencement of the Semester I.

**Duration:** Three years

**Award of Degree:** On successful completion of the Program, students will be awarded the LL.B degree by the University, subject to University regulations.

4. The University provides platform to talented school going students of Simalia to present their traditional tribal dance performance during Independence Day and republic Day celebration.
5. Prof. ORS Rao, Vice Chancellor, distributed blankets to the villagers staying surrounding the villages as a step towards Social Outreach.
6. Clothes were distributed to underprivileged people to protect them from the severe winter .
7. Prof ORS Rao, Vice Chancellor of the University, interacted with the school children from the neighbouring Simalia village, who are being given remedial classes in the evenings, by the faculty members of the University, under the leadership of Prof Arvind Kumar, Registrar.
8. 10. Over 90% of them were girls. All the trainees were offered employment by reputed healthcare services organisations.
11. Free medical camp was conducted in old age home in Nagri, in the outskirts of Ranchi.
12. 25 selected entrepreneurs were trained, in association with Bosch, to start skilling centers all across Jharkhand. 8 Entrepreneurs launched skill development centres in Ranchi, Bokaro, Gola and Hazaibagh
13. “VIDYA DAAN”, an innovative social outreach initiative was launched to improve the education standard and inculcate information technology skills among the Rural Students in the neighboring villages. Six computers, library books and magazines were donated for the benefit of the rural students.
14. A Summer Youth Camp organized for rural students which included many fun filled activities like YOGA , IT Skills, general awareness, dance, singing.

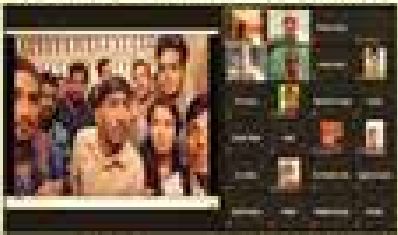


## ICFAI University begins MBA for working professionals

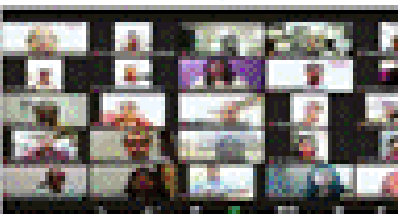
